FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

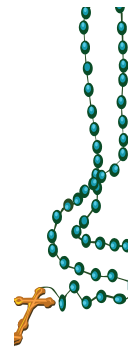
When do the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ? Traditionally for most of us it has been when the priest says "This is my Body".

Today this answer can be found in the Catechism (#1353) that as soon as the institution narrative begins the Lord is present in the elements of the bread and wine. That is why the universal law of the Church directs the assembly to kneel for this part of the Eucharistic prayer, even though in the United States we are already kneeling at that point.

There is a deeper more personal question. At what point do we become the Body and Blood of Christ? The Bread and Wine are not consecrated for their own sake after all, but for the good of the Church and for the world. The question is worth thinking over. Maybe knowing the answer to "when" the Bread and Wine are transformed will lead to the more critical and personal question as to "Why the Lord comes to us in Holy Communion".
